Next Steps - May 2018

My child finds their learning activities hard enough.

- We will focus on increasing differentiation within classes.
- We will send home children's Literacy and Numeracy jotters on a monthly rotational basis.
- We will continue to invite selected children to participate in the Scottish Mathematical Challenge.
- We will alert children to local and national competitions that they can enter if they wish.
- We will use some of our Pupil Equity Funding time to challenge the more able children.
- We will regularly discuss learning with children to find out if they find it too easy.

The information I receive about how my child is doing reaches me at the right time.

- We will send home children's Literacy and Numeracy jotters on a monthly rotational basis.
- We will continue to include advanced notice of diary dates in the school newsletter and this will also be available on our school website.
- We will ensure that we have an up-to-date list of families who require 2 copies of information.

I understand how my child is assessed.

- We will prepare a leaflet on how children's learning is assessed for distribution to parents at our first Parents' Night in October 2018 and make this available on our school website.
- We will continue to include information on how children's learning will be assessed in our class newsletters.

The school gives me advice on how to support my child's learning at home.

- We will post ideas on how parents can support their children at home on our new School App which will be launched at the start of next session.
- We will prepare leaflets highlighting to parents what they can do to support their children with their learning at home and also post this information on our school website.

The school organises activities where my child and I can learn together.

- We have applied for funding to support a family learning and cookery club in the school.
- Following staff training, we will showcase our learning on Big Maths by inviting parents into classes to see this in action.
- SMT will discuss family learning opportunities with staff as part of Forward Planning dialogues.
- All classes will invite their parents into school to share in the children's learning on at least 2
 occasions per year.

- We will continue to make use of a Suggestion Box at the main entrance.
- We will continue to have a 'You said ... We did' display at the main entrance.
- We will continue to include 'You said ... We did' comments in monthly school newsletters and on our school website.

- We invited a representative from the Parent Council to the P1 Induction session.
- We will continue to invite the Parent Council to have a stall at Parents' Evenings.
- The Parent Council have their own noticeboard outside the school, detailing minutes of meetings and forthcoming events.

- We will discuss these comments with Parent Council at their first meeting next session.
