During this event you will have the opportunity to work alongside your child as he/she engages in a range of Literacy activities. We look forward to seeing you there.

As a school, we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Thursday**, 5<sup>th</sup> March. To alleviate pressure on families, all activities will take place in class and we have chosen not to ask children to dress up again this year. Instead, we will be hosting a special assembly and the children will be engaging in a number of different fun activities in their classrooms.

Following the success from last term, our P5 Library Committee will be organising another Book Swap on Friday, 6th March. To participate in this, children are asked to bring in a book that they have finished with and swap this for another book completely free of charge.

#### Library Project

Our whole school library project is now well under way with some of our older classes now visiting Blantyre Library for the second time this time. We are delighted to see the number of children who have since joined the library and will issue their new membership cards as soon as they arrive. In addition, our P5 Junior Librarians have visited both Blantyre Library and the school library at Netherburn Primary near Larkhall to gain ideas on what to include in our own school library and will begin planning their design over the next fortnight or so.

As part of our library project, we are also keen to involve parents/carers and other family members in a range of reading activities which will offer support to children from stages of the school. To explain more about the exciting and innovative opportunities that we have planned, we will be hosting a Parent/Carer Information session on Thursday, 19th March from 2.00pm - 3.00pm and would be delighted if you could attend.

#### Pupil Sickness

Please remember that if your child has suffered from sickness or diarrhoea, he/she should stay at home for at least 48 hours (2 days) after their symptoms stop to prevent the infection being passed on to anyone else. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

#### Mobile Phones

We strongly discourage children from bringing their mobile phones to school as we cannot be held responsible if they are damaged or stolen. If your child does bring his/her mobile phone to school, it must be switched off at all times whilst in the building and in the playground. Phones should not be used until children leave the school gates at the end of the day. Please remember that any messages that you need to get to your child during the school day should be delivered via staff in our school office.














# **Inclement Weather**

#### **Ready Steady Learn Books**

As you know, every child has now been issued with a new Ready Steady Learn book for this term. This book shall be sent home at least once per week and you are asked to sign to say that you have seen it. Comments from parents/carers are also welcome. So that we are able to keep you informed about your child's learning and behaviour in school, we would be grateful if you could ensure that your child's Ready Steady Learn book is signed and returned to the school the day after it has been sent home. If your child has their book signed, he/she will gain an extra House point and, given that there were only 2 points between the House that came in first and second last week, every point is crucial.

#### **Chewing Gum**

Unfortunately, a few children are still bringing chewing gum in to school. Please remember that chewing gum is not permitted anywhere in our school. This includes our classrooms, as well as our playground since not only is it a choke hazard, but it can cause a terrible mess to school property and children's clothing. 
#### Support for Families

Should your child require to take any medication in school, it is essential that you complete an 'Administration of Medicine' form. A copy of this form is available from the school office. Only medication provided with written parental/carer consent will be able to be administered. It is the responsibility of parents/carers to ensure that medication is within its use by date.

#### Indoor Shoes

We have noticed that a few children still do not have a pair of indoor shoes. In order that we can keep the carpeted areas of our school clean, it is important that all children remove their outdoor shoes when they enter the building. Please let us know if there is anything that we can do to support you with this.





#### **Credit Union**

We would like to remind all of our families that our Credit Union collection point takes place every Monday morning in the school. This is managed and run by our P6 children as part of their active numeracy. Should your child want to become a member of our Credit Union, please contact the school for an application form.
