To all of our children and families,

I hope that you are all safe and well and that you enjoyed the Spring Break. The weather was amazing! All of the staff and myself are missing you all so much. Our daily lives are very unsettled at present, but I hope that you are managing to adjust to the 'new normal'.

Our teachers are currently working very hard to provide weekly home learning activities and I hope that you are finding these useful. These activities contain a mixture of Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing tasks, as well as some interdisciplinary learning linked to class topics and/or special focus weeks in the school. All activities are uploaded onto the school website under the 'Home Learning' tab, as well as posted on our school app every Monday morning. Starting on **Monday**, **4**th **May**, we will also be introducing Google Classroom for all stages apart from our Nursery, having successfully piloted this with our P7 class for the past fortnight. This can be accessed via a code that we have published on our school app. Alternatively, parents/carers can contact their child's class teacher via email to get this code. Please note that the code is different for each class. Google Classroom allows for communication between the child and his/her teacher, as well as the opportunity to ask any questions that he/she might have regarding their home learning activities. A helpsheet explaining how to access Google Classroom has also been added to our school website, as well as added as a document on our school app.

Participation in home learning helps us to know that our families are safe and well. Whilst we would encourage the children to complete the activities, our priority at the moment is wellbeing and maintaining strong and positive relationships with our children and families, so please do only what is manageable. Please also remember that there is no expectation that everyone does everything. I am sure that many of our children will also be learning valuable life skills as they help out with odd jobs at home, too.

Teachers email addresses are included in each home learning pack. There is no expectation to post or provide evidence of completed tasks. Nevertheless, staff would love to hear from the children, even if it is just to say hello! I know that some of you have already been posting pictures and videos on Twitter, so thank you for this. What has impressed me most is that everyone seems so happy and relaxed, which is the most important thing during this time. Google Classroom will also allow children to send examples of their learning to their own class teacher and staff will respond to this at some point during the school day (9.00am – 3.00pm). Nursery parents/carers should continue to make use of their Learning Journals to communicate with staff about their children's successes. Anything that is posted will receive a response.

As a school, staff have also been working on pupil reports. These will be issued once school re-opens, although we do not yet know when this will be. A number of staff have also been volunteering in one of the hubs that have been established in South Lanarkshire to provide emergency childcare for the children of key workers. We thank those involved for all their efforts in supporting this crucial resource.

South Lanarkshire Council aim to ensure that no pupil is disadvantaged, especially during the Covid-19 school closure. They are hoping to ensure all learners have everything they need for their wellbeing and to continue learning at home. As a result, they are offering families a range of supports, which will be delivered directly to homes, to support them at this difficult time:

- Sanitary products
- IT device

- Internet access
- Physical resources, e.g. pens, pencils, paper, ruler, chalk, paint, scissors, glue, etc.
