Homework

One of our members of staff has a peanut allergy, so please could we ask that your child does not bring in any products containing peanuts for their snack or lunch. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.



Pupil Absence



Please note that it is the parent/carer's responsibility to notify the school or nursery if their child is going to be absent before 9.10am. If we do not receive either a letter or a phone call from a parent/carer, we will try to phone home and, if unsuccessful, we will then phone your child's emergency contacts, then possibly the Police. It is, therefore, vitally important that you notify us of any changes to your contact details as soon as possible.

Black History Month

Black History Month is celebrated every October in the UK. As a school, we marked this with a special whole school assembly to help raise children's awareness of and tolerance for cultural differences. Each class also had their own focused lessons and we are creating a display about what they learned in our dining hall.

Attendance at School

Over the next few days, all children will be issued with a letter showing their current level of attendance. Please support us in trying to increase our attendance to within national expectations. Thank you.

Did you know....?

- 96% attendance = 7-8 days of lost learning
- 95% attendance = 2 weeks of lost learning
- 93% attendance = 3 weeks of lost learning
- 90% attendance = 1 month of lost learning
- 80% attendance = 2 months of lost learning
- Children who have an average of 90% attendance every year will have lost the equivalent of 1 year of schooling by the time they are in S3

Timekeeping

Unfortunately, an increasing number of children are appearing late for school. This can then cause disruption in class as teachers may need to go back over something that a child has missed. It also causes a lot of embarrassment for your child. Please remember that our school starts at **8.55am** so we would be grateful if you could support your child to be on time every day. Thank you.

Anti-Bullying Week

Warm Clothing

As the weather has now turned much colder, we would be grateful if all parents/carers could ensure that their child wears a warm, waterproof jacket when coming to school. We currently have a number of jackets on our recycling rail outside our main office, should this be of any help to families.





Incredible Years Programme

We are in the process of organising a new programme for our parents/carers called 'Incredible Years' in partnership with 2 Parenting Support Workers. This small group programme will take place in our school during the school day and is designed to promote social and emotional wellbeing in children and families. It will also help all participants to enhance their parenting skills, as well as offer guidance on how to mitigate behavioural concerns that you may be experiencing with your child at home.

If this programme is something that would be of interest to you, please contact Mrs McGeehan, our Depute Head Teacher (glow.sch.uk). She will also be able to answer any questions that you may have. We already have a number of parents/carers who have signed up, but it would be great if we could have a few more.



False Nail Extensions

We have noticed that a few children are coming to school with false nail extensions. Please note that these are unacceptable for school as they restrict the things that the child can do in class and they could cause injury to either the child or someone else if they inadvertently bump into them. They are also extremely dangerous during P.E.

Pupil Sickness

Please remember that if your child has suffered from sickness or diarrhoea, he/she should stay at home for at least 48 hours (2 days) after their symptoms stop to prevent the infection being passed on to anyone else. We have a number of medically vulnerable children and staff in our establishment, so your support with this is greatly appreciated.





Administering Medicine

South Lanarkshire Council has guidelines on the administration of medication. Should your child require to take prescribed medication in school, it is essential that you complete an 'Administration of Medicine' form. A copy of this form is available on request from the school office. Pupils may carry inhalers with them, if necessary. However, should you wish your child to carry an inhaler whilst he/she in school, an 'Administration of Medicine' form must still be completed.

Only medication prescribed by a doctor and with written parental/carer consent will be able to be administered. It is the responsibility of parents/carers to ensure that medication is within its 'use by' date. Please also remember to keep us up-to-date regarding any health-related issues for your child as we are aware that these can change at any time.



Inclement Weather

Parents/carers are reminded that in the unlikely event that the school needs to remain closed because of adverse weather conditions, this information will be reported on our school X account, South Lanarkshire Council's website (www.southlanarkshire.gov.uk) and, if possible, on local radio stations. It is also vitally important that you keep us informed of any changes to your details.

Mobile Phones

We strongly discourage children from bringing their mobile phones to school as we cannot be held responsible if they are damaged or stolen. If your child does bring his/her mobile phone to school, it <u>must</u> be switched off at <u>all</u> times whilst in the building and in the playground. Any messages that you need to get to your child during the school day should be delivered via staff in our school office.





Textile Recycling Bin

Our Parent Council have a textile recycling bin located in the Coatshill Avenue car park across the road from the school. This bin will take donations of wearable clothes, paired shoes and bags. It is estimated that a full bin can raise up to £400 for school funds, so any donations that you have will be gratefully received.

Christmas Post

Our school Christmas Post will start on **Monday**, **9**th **December** and will run until **Wednesday**, **18**th **December**. This allows children to post their Christmas cards to pupils and staff using the special postbox that is located in the main office. This year, mail will be sorted by children in our P1 class with support from their P7 buddies, so please make sure that names and classes are written clearly on all envelopes. We would also appreciate it if no Christmas cards are brought into school before the starting date. Thank you.

Christmas Lunch

Our school Christmas lunch will take place on **Tuesday**, **10**th **December**. A flyer will be sent home shortly informing you of the choice of menu that will be available on this day. Children are required to order in advance and all orders should be returned to the school by the date requested.



Please note that there will be no cold snacks on offer on this day. Children who do not wish to have a hot school lunch are asked to bring in their own packed lunch instead.



Children in Need/Be Bright Road Safety Day

On **Friday,15**th **November** our Charities Committee and our Junior Road Safety Committee have asked that we support BBC Children in Need, and help to raise awareness about road safety. The committees have asked that children come to school wearing brightly coloured clothing. Please do not go to any expense – your child can just wear something that they already have at home. If you wish, you can also make a donation to Children in Need through ParentPay. On the day, children will be completing a JRSO Road Safety competition and taking part in Children in Need activities in their classes.

Community Library

Our community library will be re-opening on the last Thursday of every month from 3.15pm – 3.45pm, starting on **Thursday**, **31**st **October**. This contains books for children and adults, so please come along and select something of interest to you and your family.





Breakfast Club

Our Breakfast Club continues to be popular with many families. There is no charge for this and children are offered the choice of Weetabix/toast/fresh fruit and a cup of water/milk. Children coming to Breakfast Club should enter the school via the main door **between 8.15am and 8.35am**. Unfortunately, we will be unable to accept any children outwith these times.

Children will be supervised by 2 support assistants, and they are expected to show responsible and safe behaviour at all times, following the same rules that apply in our dining hall at lunchtime. Children will then be dismissed into the playground at 8.45am, at the same time as the school gates open for all our other pupils.

Water in Class

Children are encouraged to sip **plain water** in class as research has shown that this increases their concentration when learning. This should be in a plastic sports bottle to avoid spillage. Please note that juice and flavoured/sparkling water are <u>not</u> permitted in the classrooms as they leave a terribly sticky mess if they are spilled and may spoil someone's work. Water is also served at lunchtime and children may also bring in a second bottle of water on PE days if they wish.





Parking

Concerns continue to be raised about dangerous parking at the junction between Morven Avenue and Coatshill Avenue, as well as cars being fully parked on the pavements around our school. Please could we ask that all parents/carers consider the safety of all our children when parking your car. We also politely request that parents/carers do not park in front of local residents' driveways when dropping off/picking up children.
